At present, the Government are still consulting about this policy, and so we have a number of different options depending on the outcome of the consultation. FIRST AID UPDATE

At our inset day on Tuesday, the whole staff received First Aid training. This is in addition to the paediatric first aid training that all Early Years staff receive. One of the things we learnt is that we should not be putting ice packs on injuries, including head bumps. Instead we should be using a cold compress (wet paper towel or tissue). We will be following this advice moving forward.
